

TREE HOUSE-LEEK

(*Aeonium Arboreum*)



The Tree House-Leek plant grows many stems from its roots. At the end of these stems, rosettes appear like in the picture below.



TREE HOUSE-LEEK

This plant was given its name because when it grows, it looks like a small tree.



- This plant flowers between December and April every year.
- It can grow to a height of between 40cm and 80cm tall.
- The flowers are yellow in colour and grow really close together.
- This plant likes to grow on limestone cliffs.
- The Tree House-Leek is originally from North Africa.
- We can see this plant along the south-eastern cliffs of Gibraltar or just above Camp Bay and Europa Pass.
- This plant was introduced to Gibraltar a long time ago and is now considered a local plant.
